Series Records:

BYU has a 210-93-1 record against the University of Utah. BYU's greatest and longest standing rivalry--with the University of Utah--did not start on the football field. On May 18, 1895, the Brigham Young Academy played the first ever intercollegiate event in Utah against the Utes on a baseball diamond. The game ended in a 0-0 tie and a bench-clearing brawl.

Coach Vance Law

Vance Law is in his 10th season as head coach at BYU. He played 14 years of pro ball, including 11 years in the majors with six different teams. In 2001 he was named Coach of the Year in the Mountain West Conference. The 52-year-old coach entered this season with a 287-239-2 (.546) record. He is assisted by Ryan Roberts, in his seventh year at BYU. Pitching coach Bobby Applegate is in his sixth year with BYU, having last coached at the Air Force Academy.

Hitting Streaks

Stetson Banks leads the team with a current 14-game hitting streak, followed by Sean McNaughton and Steve Parker both at nine. Kent Walton had a 16-game streak stopped last week. McNaughton had a team-best 16-game hitting streak last season, followed by Walton at 15 games.

Rare Monday Games

BYU's first game at Kansas State and its remaining game at Utah Valley are rare Monday appearances for the Cougars. As a church-sponsored university, BYU rarely plays a Monday game because of Family Home Evening. BYU has never played a game on Sunday and does not practice on that day either. In fact, BYU rejected an earned opportunity to play in the 1958 College World Series because of potential Sunday play, a rule which has since been modified as BYU played in the 1968 and 1971 College World Series. There are six Monday games on this year's schedule--all away. Thus far BYU has played on Monday at Baylor, at Wichita State, at Washington State and at Oregon State. Last year BYU played three Monday games, one at home.

Baseball-Softball Play Same Days at Home

The back-to-back Miller Park facility will host five dates when both baseball and softball compete at the same time. Larry H. Miller Field seats 2,204 fans in two-tiered permanent seating for baseball. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility.

Mar. 24 baseball hosted Utah Valley at 6 p.m., while softball opened its home season against Boise State at 5 p.m. On April 23 baseball hosts New Mexico at 7 p.m., while softball hosts Utah Valley at 6 p.m. On April 25 baseball closes a three-game series with New Mexico at 1 p.m., while softball hosts Utah at 2 p.m. On May 8-9 baseball hosts UNLV at 7 and 1 p.m., while softball hosts Colorado State at 7 and 2 p.m.--this is the same weekend BYU hosts the NCAA Men's Volleyball National Championships (May 7-9).

About the Team . . .

Oldest to Youngest

There are eight seniors and seven freshmen on the current squad. The ages range from 25-year-old Thomas Bills to 18-year-old Nathan Bunch—the next youngest are Adam Law and Marc Oslund who just turned 19 in February. Last year there were no seniors on the team.

Home Season

BYU drew 19,474 fans in its 21-game home schedule last season for an average of 927 with a 8-13 record. The Cougars schedule have a 114-54 (.678) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its eighth season since it was built. In those eight years BYU has drawn 200,331 fans for an average of 1,363 and 139,232 at night for an average of 1,450. This season BYU has drawn 11,548 fans at home, but a couple of the 13 games were not paid admission. The crowd of 3,081 against Utah this season was the fourth-largest in school history and the second-largest at Miller Park.

They Said It:

“Jeremy (Toole) is the guy we’re looking to help us. He throws his breaking ball for strike two and that gives him effective command of two pitches,” said BYU Coach Vance Law. “When you have two pitches working for you, it gives you an opportunity to be a dominant guy.”

“We didn’t have much going at any point offensively,” Utah head coach Bill Kinneberg said. “I’m a little disappointed in our offense, but I think Toole was the big reason for that. He was really good today. He was able to command his fastball, throw his breaking ball for strikes and really tied our hitters up. He got the upper hand on us.”

In Case You Missed It

BYU raised its batting average last week from .306 to .313 after batting .367, including a season-high 22 hits in game three at Western Carolina. The batting average was .320 after the Air Force Academy and is now .317 after Oregon State.. The Cougars started out hot at .436 after their first two games, then tailed off to .327 after the first home series. After the Utah series BYU was batting .308. and .305 after San Diego State.

Walton Watch

Senior Kent Walton is climbing the career ladder in several categories...see chart to the left. He is also climbing the charts in career steals for both the league and school. He is within striking distance of batting average and RBI leaders in the MWC career categories.

Two weeks ago Walton raised his batting average from .423 to .467 and his slugging percentage from .641 to .728 as BYU swept the three-game series at Western Carolina University. Walton has a 16-game hitting streak ended last week.

NCAA Statistics

Kent Walton was No. 29 in the nation in batting average at .434. Walton was No. 41 in runs scored per game at 1.32. Jordan Muir was ranked No. 11 in saves and Blake Torgerson was ranked No. 31 in walks allowed at 1.31 per game. BYU was ranked No. 15 in double plays.

Deseret First Duel, Round 2.5

The baseball portion of the Deseret First Duel continues this week with BYU and Utah. Last season BYU's baseball team earned three points in the first year of the promotion, with a run differential of 38 to 26 after the two teams split 2-2 in the four games. In the last meeting between BYU and Utah baseball the Cougars fashioned one of the most incredible comebacks in school history on May 18 at Franklin Covey Field in Salt Lake City. Down 10-0 after seven innings to the Utes in the finale, BYU scored a season-high 12 runs in the eighth, from 11 singles. BYU scored 10 of those runs before an out was made. That 13-10 victory gave the team the Deseret First Duel baseball portion of the trophy.

This year Utah leads in the overall standings, 39.5 to 20. BYU has a 2-1 lead in the baseball portion of the standings from games played earlier this year and leads in the run differential, should that factor be needed as a tiebreaker, currently at a combined 28-19. In the most recent competition, BYU's softball team won its portion of the Deseret Duel, sweeping Utah in two games last week and BYU's women's tennis team won last week in the only meeting between the two.
