Series Record:

BYU has a 68-64 record against UNLV. Coach Law has a 32-25 (.561) record against UNLV. The first meeting between the two schools was in May 1972, a 5-0 victory for BYU in Provo.

Coach Vance Law

Vance Law is in his 10th season as head coach at BYU. He played 14 years of pro ball, including 11 years in the majors with six different teams. In 2001 he was named Coach of the Year in the Mountain West Conference. The 52-year-old coach entered this season with a 287-239-2 (.546) record. He is assisted by Ryan Roberts, in his seventh year at BYU. Pitching coach Bobby Applegate is in his sixth year with BYU, having last coached at the Air Force Academy.

Hitting Streaks

Stetson Banks and Sean McNaughton lead the team with a current five-game hitting streaks. Banks had a 17-game streak and Kent Walton had a 16-game streak earlier this season. McNaughton had a team-best 16-game hitting streak last season, followed by Walton at 15 games.

East of the Rockies

BYU has played 11 times East of the Rocky Mountains this season, winning four times. That's the most times BYU has played East of the Rockies, followed by eight times (4-4) in 2007 and six times in 1999 (1-5). Overall, BYU has a 27-57 (.321) record playing East of the Rockies, including an 0-2 finish last season at the MWC Tournament vs Utah and San Diego State.

BYU at Home

BYU is batting .337 at home with a 12-4 record thus far. Michael Bowen is batting .475 in Provo this season, followed by Bryce Ayoso at .474 and Kent Walton at .406. Steve Parker leads the team with three homers hit this season at Larry H. Miller Field, followed by Bowen, Walton and Stetson Banks each with two. Walton (6-6) and Andrew Law (4-4) are perfect in stolen bases at home. The Cougars have a 3.83 ERA at home, led by Adam Miller at 3-0, 0.76 and Nathan Bunch 2-0, 1.08.

Baseball-Softball Play Same Days at Home

The back-to-back Miller Park facility will host four dates when both baseball and softball compete at the same time. Larry H. Miller Field seats 2,204 fans in two-tiered permanent seating for baseball. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility.

Mar. 24 baseball hosted Utah Valley at 6 p.m., while softball opened its home season against Boise State at 5 p.m. On April 23 baseball hosted New Mexico, while softball hosted Utah Valley. On May 8-9 baseball hosts UNLV at 7 and 1 p.m., while softball hosts Colorado State at 7 and 2 p.m.--this is the same weekend BYU hosts the NCAA Men's Volleyball National Championships (May 7-9).

About the Team . . .

Oldest to Youngest

There are eight seniors and seven freshmen on the current squad. The ages range from 25-year-old Thomas Bills to 18-year-old Nathan Bunch—the next youngest are Adam Law and Marc Oslund who just turned 19 in February. Last year there were no seniors on the team.

Home Season

BYU drew 19,474 fans in its 21-game home schedule last season for an average of 927 with a 8-13 record. The Cougars have a 126-58 (.685) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its ninth season since it was built. In the previous eight years BYU has drawn 200,331 fans for an average of 1,363 and 139,232 at night for an average of 1,450. This season BYU has drawn 13,959 fans at home, but a couple of the 15 games were not paid admission. The crowd of 3,081 against Utah this season was the fourth-largest in school history and the second-largest at Miller Park.

They Said It:

“Jeremy (Toole) is the guy we’re looking to help us. He throws his breaking ball for strike two and that gives him effective command of two pitches,” said BYU Coach Vance Law. “When you have two pitches working for you, it gives you an opportunity to be a dominant guy.”

“We didn’t have much going at any point offensively,” Utah head coach Bill Kinneberg said. “I’m a little disappointed in our offense, but I think Toole was the big reason for that. He was really good today. He was able to command his fastball, throw his breaking ball for strikes and really tied our hitters up. He got the upper hand on us.”

In Case You Missed It

BYU raised its batting average five weeks ago from .306 to .313 after batting .367, including a season-high 22 hits in game three at Western Carolina. The batting average was .320 after the Air Force Academy and is now .314 after TCU. The Cougars started out hot at .436 after their first two games, then tailed off to .327 after the first home series. After the first Utah series BYU was batting .308. and .305 after San Diego State.

- BYU's three starting freshman pitchers started the season with a combined 6-0 record before registering a loss.
- BYU has four players who are married (Stetson Banks, Thomas Bills, Dane Nielsen and Kevin Sloan).
- Incorporated into this year's team are three players who have just finished serving two-year Church missions (Stetson Banks, Seth Johnson and Dane Nielsen).
- Five players transferred to BYU this season (Shawn Hardesty, Brock Luker, Matthew Neil, Jeremy Toole and Alex Wolfe).
- Among those who could throw batting practice to BYU again this season is former Cy Young winner Vernon Law (1960 Pittsburgh Pirates), father of BYU head coach Vance Law. Vernon turned 79-years-old on March 12 of 2009 and had seven-by-pass heart surgery four years ago.

Muir-Hancock-Saves

Jordan Muir tied Ryan Hancock's season record of nine saves--see chart to the left. Hancock pitched in 11 games for the California Angels in the Majors and was Second team All-Western Athletic Conference as a quarterback for BYU also in 1992. Hancock had 15 saves in his three-year BYU career. Muir has a 14-11 career record at BYU, while Hancock was 7-7. The dozen saves by BYU this season is the most since 2007, 2002 and 2000 when it had 13. In 2008, 2005 and 1992 the Cougars had 12 saves.

Walton Watch

Senior Kent Walton is climbing the career ladder in several categories...see chart to the left. He is also climbing the charts in career steals for both the league and school (No. 5 with 50). He is within striking distance of batting average and RBI leaders in the MWC career categories.

Five weeks ago Walton raised his batting average from .423 to .467 and his slugging percentage from .641 to .728 as BYU swept the three-game series at Western Carolina University. Walton had a 16-game hitting streak earlier this season.

NCAA Statistics

Kent Walton was No. 23 in the nation in batting average at .424. Jordan Muir was ranked No. 23 in saves.

Deseret First Duel

The baseball portion of the Deseret First Duel was won BYU's baseball team for the second year in a row as the Cougars tallied a 5-1 record against the Utes this season.

Around the World in Less Than 80 Days

Through the end of the upcoming MWC Championships at Ft. Worth, BYU's baseball team will have logged more than 24,704 miles, not including round trips to the Salt Lake City airport. The mileage logged on the 11 major trips of BYU's team exceeds the circumference of the Earth (24,859 miles). Cougar trips have spanned the Atlantic Seaboard to the Pacific Coast through the air and a 1,534-mile round trip to California by bus. In the remaining four trips BYU will travel 9,452 miles, so the Cougars have logged 15,252 miles thus far.

Academically Speaking

Thomas Bills graduated last week from BYU, majoring in French Studies with a minor in chemistry. He graduated alongside his wife, Alta, who majored in recreation management.

Catcher J.T. Musso was the only Cougar nominated for the CoSida Academic All-District team with a 3.50 GPA in business.

Triple Play

BYU recorded the fourth triple play in school history and the third in MWC history (AFA and TCU) with a 5-4-3 (Parker-Andrew Law-Ko) triple play in the 12-2 game vs. New Mexico.

Inside the Park Homers

Stetson Banks used his 6.39 60-yard dash speed to great advantage against Utah Valley University for an inside-the-park home run this season. Teammate Brandon Relf had an inside-the-park homer in 2008 vs. Air Force.
